STANLEY "THE MAN" GREENBERG

Stan was born on June 6, 1937 in Boston. He grew up in an apartment at the corner of Almont Street and Blue Hill Avenue in Mattapan. When he was 12 years old, his family moved to Clarkwood Street. At age 17, they moved back to Almont Street.

He attended the Charles Logue Elementary School on Walk Hill Street from Kindergarten to 6th grade, the Solomon Lewenberg Junior High School and graduated from Roxbury Memorial High School for Boys in 1955.



Stan went to the Mass. College of Pharmacy for one year and took a year off to broaden his learning skills.

He transferred to the New England College of Pharmacy in 1957 and graduated in 1961. Stan gained experience as a pharmacist working part time in several stores including Dave Berger's. His father owned a drug store (*do you remember when they used to really be drug stores?*) and when he became ill, Stan took over his business and ran it until 1973 when he decided to close it.

Over the years, he was employed as a pharmacist by Dunnington's, F & M, CVS and Phamarica until 2004. He decided that he wanted to spend his winters in Florida and has been able to continue his pharmacist career and winter vacations since then.



Stan and his future bride, Jane, met on a blind date on April 4, 1959. After meeting Stan, Jane said that she would never go on a blind date ever again. Jane was a student at State College of Boston which was a teaching college. They were married on September 2, 1962. Jane went back to Lesley College to get her Master's Degree at age 40. She still teaches on-line for Framingham State University. They have two daughters – Bonnie and Marla.

Stan has been a member of the Sharon Men's Club for the past three years and has enjoyed the meetings. Unfortunately, he currently works Tuesday mornings and can't get to them at this point. He is a charter member of Canton Lodge of the Knights of Pythias and also a Past Chancellor. He ran the PeeWee Division of the Sharon Little League and has volunteered at the pharmacy of the New England Sinai Rehab Hospital in Stoughton. He also worked at MCI Norfolk prison back in the 80's.
