1. 7:03 p.m. Attendance

2. 7:05 p.m. Public **comment** period

Three Sharon residents Tamara BX, Mira BX, Richard Kramer spoke to the committee about speakers who were considered for presentations to Sharon Public Schools, and about their views on diversity, equity, and inclusion and the DEI Committee.

3. 7:12 p.m. Email correspondence

Because of the absence of the correspondence clerk, recent correspondence will be presented at the next meeting.

4. 7:15 p.m. Approval of DEIC meeting minutes from 2/8/24.

Lajos Kamocsky motioned the acceptance of the minutes of 2/8/24. Shelley Keimach seconded. Seven votes in favor. One Abstention (not present at the meeting).

5. 7:17 p.m. DEI training module with entry/exit survey for town committees: update
Bill Kondrath reported that he talked to Melissa Imbaro Wednesday and that 32 people completed the training. She will be sending out a reminder to those who had not completed the training. One person had reported that they had said that they were happily surprised that the training was better than they expected.

6. 7:19 p.m. Sharon's newest residents: update

Shelley Keimach reported that some of the new residents are becoming employed. There is still a large need for diapers.

7. 7:20 p.m. Juneteenth discussion

Shelly, Kim Hokanson, Alison Kellom, and Chandu Krishnan met with members of SREA and the Sharon Cultural Council. They are planning an event that will take place around Juneteenth (June 19) for an art show, including poetry and spoken word at the Sharon Community Center.

7. 7:22 p.m. SMS guest author appearance announcement and cancellation discussion.

The Chair of DEIC mentioned that there is a perception that DEIC that some groups are not recognized as marginalized groups and protected. They said that the Sharon DEI Committee works hard to celebrate and protect both our Jewish and Muslim neighbors. We celebrate and protect our Asian, Black, Indian, Indigenous, Israeli, and Latinx neighbors. We recognize, celebrate and protect our neighbors with disabilities, and our LGBTQ+ neighbors. We recognize our socio-economic diversity and try to bridge our socio-economic barriers. And this is not an exhaustive list. We care about our entire community as a whole. Sometimes recognizing our diversity causes discomfort. And that can be grating and erodes our sense of belonging in our community. At this inflection point, let's lead with empathy, nuance and understanding for each other, even when we feel differently. I believe all of us, not just people of one faith tradition, or race, or culture, can work together to bridge misunderstanding and to move forward. I truly believe that our diversity and our passion for what we believe makes Sharon a wonderful place to live. I wonder how others on the committee feel.

Kim mentioned the letter from the rabbi of Sharon today.

Chandu mentioned that the rabbis' letter was addressed to the Jewish community, Toben mentioned that the letter had been shared on social media and that they received it from their temple and asked for and received their rabbi's permission to share it with our committee.

At no point was the Sharon DEIC consulted about inviting or un-inviting the Muslim speaker at the middle school. It would be unusual for the School Committee or the SPS administration to consult with DEIC about a curriculum choice.

Shelley said that she hoped that there is a way for us to bridge the differences between the Jewish and Muslim communities and with the Jewish community as well.

Wenxiao Tiano, as the School Committee liaison to the Sharon DEIC, clarified that DEI school initiatives and DEI initiatives in the town are in different buckets. And the School Committee just on-boarded a new DEI Director. Even families with children in the schools, but without children in the middle school, did not receive the letter about the middle school speaker. These are not decisions that the School Committee has purview over.

With diversity, can come friction. Who can host and moderate discussion?

CP Pototsky said that even as a student at the high school, they had not received the letter from the superintendent. They received it only from Toben. CP had heard some students ask: Why was the speaker uninvited, and perhaps it was no longer safe for the speaker to come. Her book wasn't about Israel/Palestine, why did that become part of the discussion? It was about her being a person of color at a prestigious academic school system.

There was a lot of misinformation circulating, and some parents were concerned for their children's safety. The schools are aware of the misinformation, and they need to find some way to address that.

Kim said that she has a middle school student and would like to see students have some input into the discussion as appropriate without dumping it on them. Her experience is that difficult dialogues work best when there is some large forum discussion, which quickly moves into smaller groups where people can get to know one another as people and where it can be on-going and not one event. She said, her family moved to Sharon for the racial, religious, economic and other diversity.

Wenxiao, speaking as a parent—not as a School Committee member—said that she wanted to be sure that education of her children was foremost and that sometimes influences from outside become distractions to fundamental education.

Lajos Kamocsky said that he has a student in the middle school. His child had heard that some students were not going to school on Monday because of the event. Lajos appreciated the letter from the rabbis, which looked forward and how there can be repair.

Kim and Wenxiao both acknowledged the dimensions of this issue that go beyond education of children at the school. Shelley, as the co-president of the Sharon Pluralism Network (SPN) would like to speak with members of that group to see if they can offer some help with the wider community dimensions outside the school.

Toben suggested that perhaps SPN might talk with some members of DEIC about how to look forward and think about healing. They thanked the members for having a difficult conversation. Toben handed over the chair to Alison while they attended to their children.

Religious observances are taken almost exclusively from the Anti-Defamation League's (ADL's) Calendar of Observances. That document notes: "The calendar includes significant religious observances of the major faiths represented in the United States. It can be used when planning

school exam schedules and activities, workplace festivities and community events. Note that Bahá'í, Jewish and Islamic holidays begin at sundown the previous day and end at sundown on the date listed.”

The ADL notes: “The calendar notes U.S. holidays that are either legal holidays or observed in various states and communities throughout the country. Important national and international observances that may be commemorated in the U.S. are also included.”


